### 3. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

#### Emergency Overview

- Causes mild skin and eye irritation
- Mildly harmful if swallowed

#### Potential Health Effects

**Inhalation:**

Mildly harmful if swallowed.

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### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

**Inhalation:**

Remove to fresh air. If not breathing gives artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Keep person at rest and warm. Treat symptomatically and supportively as and when required. Obtain medical advice if necessary.

**Ingestion:**

Have victim rinse mouth thoroughly with water. Give water to dilute the material if victim is alert and not convulsing. Do not induce vomiting. If spontaneous vomiting occurs, have victim lean forward with head down to avoid breathing in of vomits, rinse mouth and administer more water. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Qualified medical personnel should perform administration of oxygen. Seek medical advice immediately.

**Skin Contact:**

Remove any contaminated clothing. Wash skin with soap or mild detergent and water for at least 15 minutes. Get medical attention if irritation develops or persists. Wash clothing before re-use.

**Eye Contact:**

Immediately flush eyes with lukewarm water or saline solution for at least 15 minutes, lifting lower and upper eyelids occasionally. Check for and remove any contact lenses after 5 minutes of flushing. Get medical attention immediately.

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## 5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

### **Fire:**

Not considered to be a fire hazard.

### **Fire Extinguishing Media:**

Extinguish small fires with carbon dioxide, dry powder or alcohol-resistant foam. Water spray or fog can be used for larger fires or cooling of unaffected stock.

### **Special Information:**

In the event of a fire, wear full protective clothing and NIOSH-approved self-contained breathing apparatus with full-face piece operated in the pressure demand or other positive pressure mode. Fire may produce irritating or poisonous vapours, mists or other products of combustion.

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## 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

### **Spills:**

Pick up and place in a suitable container for reclamation or disposal, using a method that does not generate dust.

**Large Spills:** Use a shovel to put the material into a convenient waste disposal container. Wash the contaminated area with soap or detergent solution. Contain spillage and contaminated water for subsequent disposal.

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## 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Keep in tightly closed container in a shaded, well-ventilated area, away from heat, sparks and other sources of ignition. Protect against physical damage. Observe all warnings and precautions listed for the product.

### **Ventilation system:**

In general, dilution ventilation is a satisfactory health hazard control for this substance. However, if conditions of use create discomfort to the worker, a local exhaust system should be considered.
